Latest LA County Health Order

LA County Health Officials have issued new guidance concerning the [“Stay at Home” Order](#). Allowable recreation activities now include swimming, surfing, running, walking, skating, and biking.

An interactive dashboard is available that provides an overview on COVID-19 testing, cases and deaths along with maps and graphs showing testing, cases and death data by community poverty level, age, sex and race/ethnicity. The Department of Public Health reminds everyone that if you are ill, even with mild symptoms, please self-isolate at home for 7 days and until you are fever and symptom free for 72 hours. If you have been in close contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 or is presumed to be infected with COVID-19, you must quarantine for 14 days from your last contact with that individual. Individuals who are elderly or who have underlying health conditions may be at higher risk of serious illness and should contact their doctor as soon as they are sick.

LA County Roadmap to Recovery

LA County is currently in “Stage 2” on the Roadmap to Recovery and allows for the restricted opening of several non-essential business operations. Information on Testing in LA County

In addition to the 35 drive-up testing sites throughout LA County for LA County residents that are safe, free, and do not require proof of medical insurance, we are also offering drive-thru testing on the SCU campus for residents of any county. To schedule a COVID-19 test at SCU, call 562.943.7125 or visit <https://scuhealth.org/covid19testing/>.

To seek testing at another LA County testing site, visit covid19.lacounty.gov/testing or dial 2-1-1. You must have an appointment for a test, but there are many time slots available—including same-day, or next-day appointments.

If you are having difficulty breathing or have a high fever or other worrisome symptoms, call 9-1-1.
