Under his leadership since 2009, SCU has evolved into a nationally recognized institution in integrative and whole-person healthcare education. Dr. Scaringe has driven transformative organizational growth, strategic innovation, and academic excellence, positioning SCU as a model of institutional sustainability and interprofessional collaboration. His tenure reflects a record of mission-driven leadership, fiscal responsibility, and enduring cultural impact across higher education and healthcare communities.

Institutional Growth and Academic Expansion

- Guided SCU through a transformational decade of growth, evolving from a single-location university offering 8 programs in 2019 to a multi-campus, multi-disciplinary institution projected to offer 30 programs across four geographic locations by Fall 2026.
- Increased active student population by 215%, from 806 students in 2019 to a forecasted 2,533 students in 2026, supported by the strategic launch of new graduate and first-professional programs.
- Established new learning sites in Phoenix, San Diego, and Chicago, positioning SCU as a national leader in integrative and whole health education.
- Advanced SCU's reputation as a Whole Health University, integrating interprofessional education and evidence-informed healthcare into all programs.

Financial Performance and Institutional Sustainability

- Achieved a 135% increase in operating revenue, from \$27M in FY2018–2019 to a forecasted \$63.6M by FY2025–2026, including contributions from new campuses and program launches.
- Grew total net assets by more than 210%, from \$21.3M in FY2019 to a projected \$45.5M by FY2026, demonstrating financial resilience and effective fiscal stewardship.
- Maintained a composite financial score averaging 2.5–3.0, reflecting strong fiscal health throughout a period of national higher education contraction.
- Increased SCU's quasi-endowment from \$3.4M to \$25M, ensuring long-term institutional stability and capacity for strategic investment.

- Designed and executed SCU 2.0, a multi-phase institutional turnaround transforming SCU from financial deficit to sustained surplus within three years.
- Launched the SCU 2024–2029 Strategic Plan, positioning SCU as the industry leader in integrative, whole-person health education across four strategic goals:

 - Financial Health and Sustainability
 - Forward-Thinking, Inclusive Institutional Culture
 - National Leadership in Integrative Whole Health
- Implemented a university-wide brand strategy reinforcing SCU's identity as The Integrative Whole Health University.
- Oversaw the development of the *Institute for the Advancement of Whole Health*, expanding SCU's reach as a thought leader in value-based healthcare and interprofessional education.
- Executed definitive acquisition agreement with Pacific College of Health and Science (PCHS), expanding SCU's footprint to include campuses in San Diego and Chicago.
- Opened the Phoenix Metro Learning Site to expand access in the Southwest region.
